I. Welcome and Introductions

Chair Kristi King-Brock called the meeting to order welcoming everyone and reminded all in attendance the meeting was being recorded. Introductions were made from everyone present. Chair King-Brock congratulated Youth Committee member Jason Duncan for his company's recent recognition for being in business in Oconee County for 50 years and announced that Oconee County has embraced the Youth Apprenticeship Program.

II. Review of Minutes

The minutes from the May 04, 2015 meeting were emailed with the meeting notice and included in the meeting packet, Chair King-Brock stated any corrections or amendments to the minutes will need to be communicated with Patty Manley as a vote to approve the minutes will be taken at the next meeting.

III. Palmetto Youth Connections (PYC) Report

Karen Craven provided an update on Palmetto Youth Connections (PYC) and referred to the Dashboard Report handout provided. Ms. Craven provided an overview on the PY'14 enrollment and training numbers and highlighted the demographics of participants and the caseload breakdown by Career Coach as well as

County stating a total of 201 participants were served in active and follow-up. Ms. Craven stated the total served for PY'14 was 198 out of 185 planned.

Ms. Craven reported on WIA Performance stating PYC is meeting or exceeding all measures and reviewed the following PY'14 Outcomes:

- 81 positivie placements for Employment/Education/Military since 7/1/14 PYC's performance is 82.2 % out of a goal of 80.0%
- Total of 48attainments of a Degree/Certificate & 71 Occupations Credentials since 7/1/14 PYC's performance is 83.5% out of a goal of 80.0%
- Literacy/Numeracy Gains are 48 since 7/1/14 the goal is 67.6%; PYC's actual performance is 80%.

Ms. Craven referred to the PY'14 Monthly Update Report handout and provided a brief overview stating of the WIA participants enrolled, 57 are carryovers from and 141 are new enrollments for this program year. Ms. Craven added there are currently 52 individuals receiving follow-up services at this time.

Ms. Craven also noted 6 students from Cresent HS graduated with dual credit diploma – HS Diploma and Basic Electronic Certification from TCTC reporting the following work experience placements for these students:

- Mergon 2 placements with one being referred for an apprenticeship with Apprentceship SC.
- TTI 2 placements, both are doing very well with1 being considered for an internship.
- Quality Electric 1 placement prior to student joining military.
- 1 student was not placed due to his own choice.

Ms. Craven also called attention to the new flyers and table tents that are being used for outreach and asked Committee members to please distribute.
